## What to do after a loved one passes away

It's understandable and valid to feel overwhelmed after a loved one passes away. This is a simple checklist to help remind you of the important things to get done. You can download and print this checklist out to keep track of your progress.

Please be advised, this checklist is not meant to be exhaustive. It is simply a guide and not an official "one-size-fits-all" list of steps to follow. Each person's and every family's circumstances are different and may require different tasks and considerations.

### A checklist

Immediately after a loved one passes away	COMPLETE
Get a legal pronouncement of death by a physician, facility nurse or hospice nurse.	$\bigcirc$
Speak with the nurse or hospital about transportation arrangements for your loved one.	$\bigcirc$
Determine if funeral arrangements were made. Your loved one's will may contain certain wants or wishes.	0
Inform your employer and request bereavement time off.	$\bigcirc$
Schedule a family meeting to talk through funeral arrangements or get them started. Delegate specific tasks to family and friends.	0
Inform family, friends and important contacts such as clients, neighbors, educational institutions, health care providers or employers, if applicable.	0
Determine care for your loved one's pets.	$\bigcirc$

Make sure their property is safe and secure and someone trustworthy has the keys to both their property and any vehicles.	0
Meet with a funeral home or cremation services representative.	0

## Within a couple weeks after a loved one passes away

COMPLETE

<ul> <li>Get 20 copies of the death certificate from the vital records office of the state they passed away in.</li> <li>Find your loved one's will and determine the executor (the person who will administer the provisions of the will).</li> <li>If there is no will, probate court may be needed to settle your loved one's estate. Contact your local probate registry or hire a probate attorney to help guide you.</li> </ul>		0
Make an inventory of all your loved one's assets and track down their location.		0

#### Within a couple weeks after a loved one passes away

Delete or memorialize social media and email accounts. Ask for help from family or friends, if needed.	$\bigcirc$
